They will be mentored by the new year eight student librarians so they can enjoy being a student librarian to the fullest.

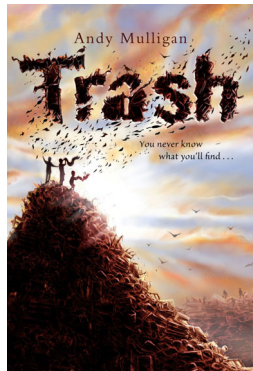
